NEG WARNING

NEG Motorcycle Marshals will be present on the race to assist in the safe passage of the race. The NEG will when safe to do so alert other road users to the presence of the race. Riders are reminded that they have an obligation to look after their own safety and obey the Highway Code. The presence of NEG Marshals does not imply that the road is closed and riders should be aware of oncoming and passing traffic and stay to the left lane of the carriageway unless otherwise instructed. NEG Marshals will make use of whistles, horns and flags to warn of danger or their presence. Riders should be particularly observant at these times. Riders should allow passage of NEG Motorcycles wherever possible and obey instructions and directions of both Static and Motorcycle Marshals.





IMPORTANT NOTES: COMPETITORS MUST READ

- Race HQ – Priddy Village Hall, open from 9.00am. Please keep clean and tidy.
- Car Parking – Please obey instructions from parking attendants. PLEASE PARK THOUGHTFULLY.
- NO PARKING NEAR THE START AND FINISH LINE.
- 9:45 (Women's race) and 12:45 (Men's race) – Safety Briefing for Marshals/Race Convoy/National Escort Group, meet with Chief Marshal in HQ.
- Sign on for Women's race by 10:00 and for Men's race by 13:00 after which reserves will be admitted.
- 10:15 (Women's race) and 13:15 (Men's race) – Pre-race briefing for riders in HQ (ESSENTIAL ALL RIDERS ATTEND).
- Juniors must report to the licence steward for a gear check prior to signing on. Maximum Gear = 7.93 metres (52x14).
- Only official vehicles are allowed in the race convoy.
- Spectators must not follow the race, you should drive the circuit in the opposite direction.
- Helmets must be worn by all riders whilst competing.
- To ride you must hold a 2019 British Cycling Race Licence.
- Please be considerate to the neighbours at the HQ, we wish to use the HQ for future years.
- Please use the changing facilities and toilets provided. Anyone caught urinating outside will be disqualified and fined.
- Remember you are ambassadors for our sport, respect the rules of the road and obey the instructions of the Chief Commissaire. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.
- Please be considerate of horses and other road users.
- Prize presentation will be held shortly after each race finishes at the race HQ.
- Coffee, Tea and cakes available at the HQ.

RACE DIRECTIONS

Assemble at Race HQ

Race to form up at Priddy Village Hall (Race HQ) ready for 10:30 (Women's race) and 13:30 (Men's race) start.

Race Route

Partial First Lap

Departing from Priddy Village Hall turn right onto unclassified road and then turn right onto B3135. The road then descends to reach a sharp left hand turn onto B3134 (Take Care - keep to the left hand side of the road). The road continues to roll slightly before riders take the left hand turn B3371 into the finishing straight. Continue to finish area to complete the partial first lap.

Laps 2 to 5 (Women's race) and 2 to 8 (Men's race) - 13km per lap

On B3371 the road then descends (Take Care - narrow sections) before reaching the junction near the top of Cheddar Gorge, where riders turn sharp left towards Wells, back onto B3135. The road continues to rise gradually for a number of kilometres then descends to reach a sharp left hand turn onto B3134 (**Extreme Care** - keep to the left hand side of the road, see safety note below *). The road continues to roll slightly before riders take the left hand turn onto B3371 into the finishing straight. Continue to finish area to complete the remaining laps.

Safety Note*

We need to raise awareness of the crossroads at the junction with B3135 / B3134. This would be known as Plummers Lane (Point 5 on map below but ID No. 10 on Risk Assessment). This location is currently being looked into by Police, and other agencies, due to the fatal collisions which are occurring here. Riders must not go wide when exiting left onto that junction, and they must keep to their side of the road. Accredited Marshalls need to be aware of the speed of traffic using this road, in particular motorcycles.

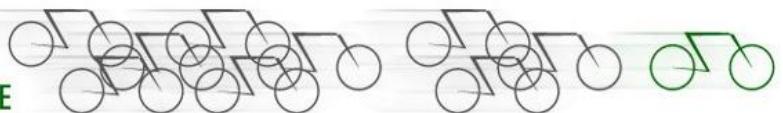

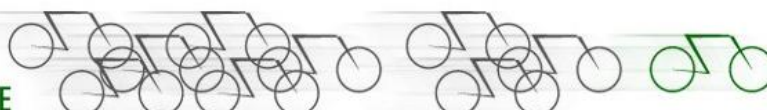
